DRESS CODE:

While at camp, we ask students and adults to:

- Wear modest shorts. When hands are extended to the back or the front, fingertips must touch fabric. Sleeveless shirts and tank tops are now allowed during daytime activities. Shirts with spaghetti straps, open backs or excessive armpit cutouts which expose torso and undergarments are NOT allowed. Large t-shirts that cover shorts should not be worn.
- Wear closed-toe and closed-heel shoes while at recreation and track times (Centrifuge) and on ministry sites (MFuge) and during Mega Relay.
- Wear modest, one-piece bathing suits or two-piece suits covered with a dark colored t-shirt, if participating in water activities.
- Wear modest shorts, pants, jeans, or dresses for worship. Dresses with spaghetti or small straps, open backs, and excessively short lengths are unacceptable (when hands are allowed in worship).
- Do not dress in a way that calls attention to underwear (sagging your pants, rolling down your waistbands, etc.) or wear pants or shorts with lettering on the bottom.

Make sure your students do NOT pack anything that:

- Advertises alcohol, tobacco, or illegal drugs.
- Explicitly or implicitly promotes racism, sexism, or hatred of any group or person.
- Explicitly or implicitly refers to sexual actions or situations.
- Has spaghetti/small straps or open back, except for sleepwear.

MFuge Participants:

- Those participating in Painting, Construction, and Yardwork (PCY) may be asked to wear long pants while working at certain ministry sites.

NOTE: Adult leaders have the responsibility of modeling and monitoring their group to ensure students are dressing appropriately.

WHAT TO PACK

- Linens, towels, pillows, blankets
- Water bottle you can refill and carry with you
- Closed-toe, closed-heel shoes (for outdoor activities)
- Bible, notepad, and pen
- Toiletries such as toothbrush and shampoo
- Sun protection
- Spending money for snacks, camp store, and missions offering (optional)
- Summer clothing (see dress code)
- Your favorite space/galaxy attire for Mega Relay

WHAT NOT TO PACK

- Alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs, fireworks, water guns, or any kind of weapon
- Items that may be used for pranks such as water balloons, shaving cream, silly string

NOTE: Pranks are not allowed at camp. Your church will be charged for any damages or issues related to clean up.

- iPads, iPods, gaming devices, roller blades or skateboards

NOTE: If students bring cell phones or other electronics, they are not to be out and in use during programming elements: Morning Celebrating, Bible Study, Worship, Night Life, Recreation, and Track Times/Ministry Tracks.

CAMP RULES

Please share these rules with your child:

CELL PHONES

- The decision of cell phone usage at camp is in the hands of the Group Leader of each church.
- Throughout the week, some elements may allow students and adults to join in via social media (i.e., Twitter, Instagram, Facebook, etc.) However, these opportunities are optional and will not limit the camp experience for those who do not participate.
- Unless instructed by staff, students with cell phones are not allowed to have them out or in use during programming elements: Morning Celebration, Bible Study, Worship, Night Life, Recreation and Track Times/Ministry Tracks. Ringers should be turned to silent or vibrate.

ACTIVITIES

- Participate in all activities and be on time.
- Drink plenty of water and eat three meals a day.

PARENT PACK

- Wear closed-toe and closed-heel shoes to recreation and ministry sites.
- Wear nametag at all times.

HOUSING

- Be in rooms by 11:00 PM with lights out no later than 11:30 PM.
- No guys in girls' rooms or hallways and no girls in guys' rooms or hallways.
- No public displays of affection.
- No practical jokes.

WORSHIP

Because we desire worship to be reverent and distraction free, we request:

- No gum, food, or drinks in the worship center.
- No video or flash photography are allowed before or during the worship service.

Items may be added to Dress Code and Camp Rules, as needed in regard to COVID-19 precautions. These updates will be made later, in the spring of 2022.

MATCHLESS ONE OVERVIEW

Day 1 - Matchless Sacrifice

THE GRAND NARRATIVE – ISAAC AND JESUS

Scripture: Genesis 22:1-14, Leviticus 4:27-35, Mark 15:21-37

Life questions: How does Jesus' death on the cross for your sins impact your life? What does living sacrificially for Christ mean and how can I live it out?

Abraham was ready to sacrifice his son, Isaac but God provided a ram. The priests were required to make sacrifices for the sins of the people. These were foreshadowing of the sacrifice God provided in Jesus' death on the cross for the sins of humankind. We must live sacrificially for Christ.

Day 2 - Matchless Forgiveness

THE GRAND NARRATIVE - JOSEPH AND JESUS

Scripture: Genesis 37:3-4, 18-28; 39:1-6; 41:46-49, 53-57; 42:1-26; 45:1-14, John 20:1-18

Life questions: When were you reconciled to God through Christ, receiving forgiveness for your sins? Who do you know who needs the forgiveness of Christ in his or her life?

Joseph was abandoned and sold into slavery by his brothers but God used that to provide for His people and worked through Joseph to show forgiveness to his brothers. Jesus came to earth to bring forgiveness. Through His resurrection from the dead, Jesus reconciled us to the Father, covering our sin and redeeming us so that we can have a relationship with the Father. We must accept the forgiveness of Christ and be willing to forgive ourselves and others.

Day 3 - Matchless Obedience

THE GRAND NARRATIVE - ABRAHAM AND JESUS

Scripture: Genesis 11:31-12:1-9, Genesis 15:1-21, Luke 4:1-13

Life Questions: How have you been obedient to God's leading in your life? How can you remain faithful to Him in the future?

Abraham followed God's plan and left his life as he knew it to relocate his family to Canaan. Even though Abraham was old with no children, because of his obedience, God established a covenant with him that his descendants would become a great nation. Jesus was obedient to God's leading in His life. When Satan tempted him in the dessert, he remained true to God. And, He resolved to live a perfect life on earth, to die on the cross and be raised again for the salvation of all mankind. We must be obedient and remain faithful to God's working in our lives.

Day 4 - Matchless Risk

THE GRAND NARRATIVE – ESTHER AND JESUS

Scripture: Esther 2:5-10, 15-18; 5:1-8; 8:1-13, Luke 4:31-36, Luke 19:45-48

Life questions: What does taking a risk for Christ look like? How can you muster the courage to act when the situation is risky?

Out of boldness and courage, Esther was willing to take risks for her people, the Jews, by becoming Queen and approaching the King on behalf of her people. Jesus went against the status quo, tradition, and the religious leaders in order to spread the gospel. We must take risks to share and live out Christ.
